ADA Amendments Act of 2008

The American with Disabilities Act was amended in 2008.

Among other areas affecting the life of individuals with disabilities, this law provides protection against discriminatory acts by employers on the matter of hiring, firing, promoting, demoting, providing reasonable accommodations, and other employment related-actions against such individuals.

The provisions of the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 went into effect January 1, 2009 and published in the Federal Register on March 25, 2011. The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) is tasked with the enforcement of the ADA relative to employment issues.

With the passage of the Amendments Act, **the United States Congress has effectively changed the meanings of the key terms used in the definition of a “disability” [29 CFR §1630.2(g)].** Though the definition of a person with disability reads the same, the meanings have changed. Such change has great implications on who is now covered under the ADAA.
